


Ironbridge

Ironbridge has a selection of museums celebrating the industrial revolution including Blists Hill Victorian Town, Coalport China Museum, Enginuity and many more.





Directions


- From Church Stretton, go to the village of Wall-Under-Heywood.
- Take the 2nd left after the Plough Inn, signed to Cardington and Gretton.
- At the end of this road, approx.1.5 miles, turn left immediately right, signed to Chatwall.
- Woodside Farm is 1st on the left, approx1 mile up the road, over a cattle grid.

For anyone who wants to escape to the country for one night or a longer stay, Woodside Farm is peacefully situated mid way between the market towns of Church Stretton and Much Wenlock in Shropshire.



Woodside is set on the leyhill slope between Caer Caradoc and Wenlock Edge, easily accessible, it is well situated for walking and beautiful views can be seen from the nearby Longmynd.

Guests may also like to explore historic castles, abbeys, museums and the Ironbridge Gorge World Heritage Site, birthplace of the Industrial Revolution. Several other attractions are also nearby.

Woodside Farm is a semi retired family farm rearing beef cattle and a commercial flock of breeding ewes. It is approximately 1 mile from Cardington village.
